Atopic Dermatitis (Eczema) Treatments

Atopic dermatitis can NOT be cured; it can only be treated and/or outgrown (70% chance by adolescence).

Use moisturizers every day if not too severe or "soak and seal" if more severe. Some useful products include Aveeno Baby Eczema Therapy, Rash and Itch Relief Cream from SKIN All Natural, the Mustela line of products, CeraVe SA for very dry skin. The Kirk's Castile line of skin care soaps and moisturizers are excellent.

Avoid fragrances and colorings in ANY skin care product and avoid cocamidopropyl betaine in shampoos. California Baby and Waleeda are very good shampoos.

Use dilute bleach baths to control low-grade infection 3-7 times per week. Put one quarter cup of bleach in a half tub of water, or 2 teaspoons of bleach in a gallon of water. And don't worry; this makes a solution roughly equivalent to pool water!

Mild steroids and/or Elidel or Protopic will be necessary on occasion. Typically, for kids over two, we will use Elidel or Protopic as maintenance therapy and reserve steroids for flare-ups.

Atopic dermatitis is often made worse by infections, especially staph. If bleach baths aren't enough, we may use topical or oral antibiotics. Less commonly, AD is infected with a herpes-type virus, a pox virus (molluscum) or a fungus (malassezia, or pityrosporum). These can be treated with acyclovir, 20 mg per kilo of body weight per day three times a day for a week, or Tagamet, 20 per kilo twice a day for 3 months, or Sporanox 5 per kilo once daily for 8 weeks, respectively. If we use Sporanox it is necessary to do blood tests to monitor liver functions.

Natural products that we can use include colloidal oatmeal (NOT in infants, though), aloe vera gel, topical 2% sunflower oil distillate twice a day, or an equal-parts mixture of honey, beeswax and olive oil applied daily. There is always some risk of hypersensitivity reactions to applications that are put on the skin every day, and EVEN from these natural products!

Finally, there is some recent evidence that omega-3 acids taken during pregnancy MIGHT decrease future egg sensitivity or atopic derm in the unborn baby though other allergies were not affected. ASK YOUR OB FIRST!
